CLOSER BY SEA is about loss and healing, the fragility of childhood bonds and adapting to an ever-changing landscape that is itself on the brink of disappearing.

In 1991, on a small, isolated island off the coast of Newfoundland, a twelve-year-old boy struggles to come to terms with the death of his father. It's been two years since Pierce's dad, a fisherman, disappeared at sea, his body never found. Pierce has since developed a fear of the ocean, which is problematic since he's surrounded by it. In fact, his tiny island, home to only a thousand residents, depends on the ocean for its survival. Even Pierce and his best friends, Thomas and Bennie, count on pocket money from the fish plant.


Island life is quiet and hard, but it gets even harder the day a young teen, Anna, goes missing. Pierce knows Anna. He knows her well. They shared an unusual but special bond. When she disappears without a trace, Pierce can't help but wonder what's really happened to her and why the people he cares about keep going missing.

But he's not alone, not completely. Helped along by his best friends and a new one, Bennie's cousin Emily, who's visiting from New York, Pierce sets out to find Anna. The kids soon cross paths with a mysterious islander named Solomon, a hermetic fisherman who may just know something about the missing teen. Their search brings them into contact with unrelenting bullies, magnificent sea creatures, fierce storms and glacial giants. But most of all, it brings them closer to the adult world and to leaving their childhood behind.

Perry Chafe is a Canadian television showrunner, writer, producer and songwriter. He is a co-founder and partner in Take the Shot Productions, a film and television-based production company whose work has garnered critical and commercial success both domestically and globally. Perry was the cocreator, showrunner and head writer for the TV series Republic of Doyle, which ran for 6 seasons on the CBC. He was also an executive producer and writer for the Netflix/Discovery series Frontier starring Jason Momoa. In addition, Perry was an executive producer and writer for Caught, a CBC limited series based on Lisa Moore's award-winning novel of the same name. Perry is currently a writer and producer on the new original CBC series Son of a Critch, based on the best-selling memoir from Mark Critch. Born in Petty Harbour, Newfoundland and Labrador, Perry holds a B.A from Memorial University.

# The Double Life of Benson Yu

## **Kevin Chong**

With destabilizing narrative twists reminiscent of Susan Choi's *Trust Exercise* and Charles Yu's *Interior Chinatown*, THE DOUBLE LIFE OF BENSON YU is an original look at how narrative is used to survive abuse—and how abuse warps narrative.

A twelve-year-old named Benny lives with his ailing and very traditional grandmother in a Chinatown housing project in the 1980s. Meanwhile, a burly white man named Constantine, who believes he is a medieval samurai reincarnated in the wrong body, moves into the apartment down the hall shortly after his release from a psychiatric hospital.

When Benny's grandmother is hospitalized, Benny survives on his own until a social worker begins to uncover his lies at school. Not knowing who to turn to, he is taken in reluctantly by his strange neighbour. Soon, an unlikely and poignant bond is formed as Benny and Constantine live and train together.

#### Or does it?

As this story progresses, its narrator, Yu, keeps interjecting from the present day, revealing glimmers of a real-life backstory that's darker than the one he's telling about Benny and Constantine. Eventually, his world intersects with Benny's, and Yu must confront the demon he's spent his adult life trying to evade or risk his own life—and Benny's.

Kevin Chong is the author of six books of fiction and nonfiction, most recently the novel The Plague. Kevin has been a finalist for the CBC Creative Nonfiction Prize, the Dr. Tony Ryan Book Award, the Hubert Evans Prize for Best Original Non-Fiction, and received Honourable mentions from the National Magazine Award, Forward Magazine Book of the Year and the Amazon First Novel Award.



The funny, sad and wise story of Paisley Ratchford, who overcomes her childhood struggles with OCD and finds a hopeful future in the arms of her reformed high school tormentor.

Paisley receives an unhappy 40th birthday gift: eviction from her apartment. With nowhere to go, Paisley tries to regain possession of her childhood home on Amherst Island, but her assigned lawyer is Garnet Mulligan, the community's bully of yore and her childhood tormentor. Paisley is plunged into the memory of her youth, trying to control her small world with obsessive compulsive disorder. But counting to eight and checking the stove a dozen times a day have little effect on island bullies, dysfunctional families, extra-marital trysts, and a mentally ill mother who leaves the family home to the island's feral cats. In other words, Paisley is a fighter who was never given a fighting chance. But now, risk is the only way forward. By facing Garnet and her past, she sees that her OCD can be managed, especially given a shot at a future, a roof over her head, and even unexpected love. A person can overcome her history, and she doesn't have to believe everything her brain tells her.

Claire Ross Dunn is a television and film writer from Toronto who has worked on such shows as Degrassi and Little Mosque on the Prairie. She is the author, with Elfi Schlegel, of The Gymnastics Book (Firefly Books) and she is co-writer of the play The Knitting Pilgrim, which has toured for over 50 shows and is readying for an international tour. 

Fifteen-year-old Gale is miserable in Whitehorse, that is clear to counsellor Helen Cotillard the moment Gale walks into Helen's office, accompanied by her stepmother. Helen starts seeing Gale regularly, and Gale's story and her distress at being separated from her little sister Buddie too closely parallels a calamity in Helen's own life. In beautiful prose, Jill Frayne shows the reader both the difficult landscape of the north, and the damaged landscapes of two human hearts.

Jill Frayne's first book, the travel memoir Starting Out in the Afternoon: A Midlife Journey Into Wild Land (Random House Canada, 2002), was lauded by The Globe and Mail as having writing that was "transcendental, ecstatic, as crisp and clear as Lake Superior in October". It was a finalist for a Governor General's Award. She has been published in The Walrus, Literary Review of Canada, Canadian Geographic, Up Here and Explore magazines, among others. Jill Frayne worked with kids and families in a counselling agency in northern Ontario for many years. She lives on a bush lot north of Parry Sound and spends winters in the wild mountains on the Yukon border.

# The Morning Bell Brings the Brokenhearted

## Jennifer Manuel

Molleigh Royston struggles to cope with the anger and sorrow expressed by her students in Tawakin—a tiny, remote, Nuu-chah-nulth community on the northwest corner of Vancouver Island. Things get worse when three students start behaving strangely. Hannah wears the same long sleeves every day to hide her hands. Candice shares a secret with Molleigh about the woman in the box with the baby. Odelia draws strange pictures while telling tales of the woman's silver and wooden teeth, and the extraordinary promises each tooth gives to whoever possesses them. Before Molleigh can make sense of it, a beloved elder dies and Molleigh follows a grieving Candice to the woman and her baby, despite dire warnings that sighting the woman's bones will upset the ancestors.

Thus begins Molleigh's quest to figure out why her students risked their souls to desecrate the dead. Her own discovery of the woman triggers a series of haunting events in the village. Giant boulders are placed in front of Molleigh's house, furniture in people's homes is moved mysteriously, and a house fire is started with flowers. When the unlikely storyteller is uncovered, leading to a confrontation that involves the school and the entire village, Molleigh comes to see the possibilities and limitations of being a non-native teacher of Indigenous students, with all their brilliance and resilience.

This captivating story about the complexity of hope and the nature of choice—how people come to believe in their choices and the powerful role stories play in creating that belief—unveils the sometimes fruitful yet ultimately flawed relationship between non- native teachers and Indigenous students in Canada. It's a profound and emotionally wrenching look at how the education system fails our remote, Indigenous communities, leaving everything in the hands of transient educators—both kind and wicked.

Jennifer Manuel is a writer of both literary novels and children's fiction. Her debut novel, The Heaviness of Things That Float, won the Ethel Wilson Fiction Prize and the Vancouver Sun listed it as one of the best novels of 2016. CBC named Jennifer a Writer to Watch. 



Patrik Sampler's debut climate change novel, The Ocean Container, was published in 2017 by Ninebark Press. His writing has appeared in a variety of publications, including The Guardian, The Millions, and The Scofield. Sampler has been a contributing editor for the surrealist journal Peculiar Mormyrid and devoted much of a postgraduate degree to the late-career work of Abe Kobo. He lives in British Columbia.



## In the Upper Country

The fates of two unforgettable women—one just beginning a journey of reckoning and self-discovery and the other completing her life's last vital act—intertwine in this sweeping, deeply researched debut set in the Black communities of Ontario that were the last stop on the Underground Railroad.

Young Lensinda Martin is a protegee of a crusading Black journalist in mid-18th century southwestern Ontario, finding a home in a community founded by refugees from the slave-owning states of the American south—whose agents do not always stay on their side of the border.

One night, a neighbouring farmer summons Lensinda after a slave hunter is shot dead on his land by an old woman recently arrived via the Underground Railroad. When the old woman, whose name is Cash, refuses to flee before the authorities arrive, the farmer urges Lensinda to gather testimony from her before Cash is condemned.

But Cash doesn't want to confess. Instead she proposes a barter: a story for a story. And so begins an extraordinary exchange of tales that reveal the interwoven history of Canada and the United States; of Indigenous peoples from a wide swath of what is called North America and of the Black men and women brought here into slavery and their free descendents on both sides of the border.


As Cash's time runs out, Lensinda realizes she knows far less than she believed not only about the complicated tapestry of her nation, but also of her own family history. And it seems that Cash may carry a secret that could shape Lensinda's destiny.

Sweeping along the path of the Underground Railroad from the southern States to Canada, through the lands of Indigenous nations around the Great Lakes, to the Black communities of southern Ontario, In the Upper Country weaves together unlikely stories of love, survival, and familial upheaval that map the interconnected history of the peoples of North America in an entirely new and resonant way.

Kai Thomas is a graduate of University of Guelph's Creative Writing MFA, for which the manuscript of IN THE UPPER COUNTRY was his thesis work. He has worked on the land in various capacities: building, small-scale farming, outdoor educating, planting trees. His writing stems from those experiences. He is Afro-Canadian, born and raised in Ottawa, descended from Trinidad and the British isles. IN THE UPPER COUNTRY is his first novel, he is at work on his next.

## **Everything There Is**

## MG Vassanji

The newest novel from critically acclaimed and two time Giller winner MG Vassanji explores the tension between religion and science, tradition and progress.

One of the world's most celebrated physicists, Nurul Islam, has just shown that nature's two fundamental forces are one and the same. This is the first step in the much sought after Grand Unification, a theory that would explain everything. But his personal life is torn by forces that are all too human. Born in Undivided India, haunted by the Partition, he is a citizen of Pakistan and teaches at a top British university. He is a devout Muslim, but his pronouncements on the nature of God and physics makes him a target for extremists. He refuses to give his name to his nation's nuclear weapons program, which pits the political and military establishment against him; professional animosities carry on a bitter and prolonged campaign charging him with plagiarism; he falls in love with a young American physicist and marries a second time. Passing the critical age of forty, all he wants to do is his beloved physics. But now, having been declared a heretic, he has to go home to see his dying father.

Set in the 1960s-1980s, this is a novel inspired by, but not about, a real life. The two forces referred to above are the weak and the electromagnetic forces. The novel also looks obliquely at the controversy, in Islam and Christianity, does or can God interfere with his Creation.

M.G.Vassanji is the author of nine novels, two short story collections, two memoirs and a biography of Mordecai Richler. He has been awarded the Giller Prize twice, the Governor General's Prize, and the Commonwealth First Book Prize among others. He has been shortlisted for the Writers Trust Award, and India's Crossword Prize. His work has been translated into Arabic, Dutch, French, German, Hindi, Italian, Japanese, Latvian, Portuguese, Spanish, Turkish, and Swahili. M. G.Vassanji was born in Nairobi, Kenya and raised in Tanzania. He lives in Toronto.

To escape his wrath, Kosara's only hope is to trade her powers for illegal passage across the Wall to Belograd, where monsters can't follow.

Life in Belograd should be sweet, but without her magic Kosara quickly develops the shadow sickness that kills powerless witches. She's traded a fast death at the hands of the Zmey for a slow one of turning into shadow. If she wants to live to enjoy her freedom from the Zmey, Kosara needs to get her powers back. And to do that, she'll have to team up with the suspiciously honorable detective investigating the death of the smuggler who brought her across the Wall.

Even worse than working with the cops is that all the clues are pointing in a single direction: one of the Zmey's monsters has found a crack in the Wall, and Kosara's magic is now in the Zmey's hands.

Genoveva Dimova grew up in Bulgaria and currently lives in Scotland, where she works as an archaeologist. Her first novel A Tale of Wizards, Physicists and a Dragon was published in her native Bulgaria (as Genoveva Detelinova) by MBG Books, where it was voted the Best Debut Spec-Fic of 2013 and won an encouragement award at the European Science Fiction Society Awards. Her novelette The Dragon and the Orange Juice was published by Aliterate and her short fiction has appeared in ФантAstika: Almanac of Bulgarian Speculative Fiction and Saving the World: The Best of Bulgarian SFF, among others. 

Vas's investigation into his father's disappearance leads him to beautiful Salt Spring Island, where celebrated landscape artist Jeanie Esterhazy—locked in a power struggle with two ex-nurses and caregivers—is haunted by memories of a stranger standing in the doorway of her old hospital room. Jeanie and Vas bond on a level of embodied memory, as clues to his father's disappearance emerge from her tragic past. When Savka learns that her Russian handler murdered her family in Ukraine, she lures him to a final showdown on a beach on Salt Spring Island, where both she and Jeanie learn—in a series of dramatic twists—how each person who entered Jeanie's hospital room that night in 1959 had good reason to kill Marko Ivanets.

Maia Caron is a Nanaimo, British Columbia based Indigenous writer and author of Song of Batoche, a historical novel, which was a CBC must-read book for 2018. The Toronto Star described the novel as a "tale of love, betrayal and obsession," and Shelagh Rogers of The Last Chapter said it was an "ambitious, broad, sweeping, historical mystery."
